Daily Father Joe's Villages provides 4,000 meals, child care, assessment, case management, mental health counseling, recovery services, career and education services, education at on-site elementary and high schools, and health care at the Village Family Health Clinic. The Villages has transitional housing programs for more than 881 homeless men, women, teens and children, 142 permanent housing units for low-income individuals with disabilities, and 160 permanent housing units for low-income working families and individuals.
